Report from the Leadership Board

The Leadership Board met on December 17, 2025. The members of the board serve three-year terms, so this was an occasion to thank those who were attending their last meeting. Jane Rall has served as lay leader for the past three years. She has provided important continuity, sharing her experience serving on previous committees whose responsibilities are now incorporated into a single board. Nancy Kneisly will rotate off, freeing up time to organize a local United Women of Faith, even as she retains other roles at Faith, including chair of the outreach team. Mike Kitzman's tenure was cut short by the need to move to Chicago for employment reasons, yet we appreciate the insight he brought to the board this year based on his leadership experiences at a previous church. We were pleased that Janelle Veazey has agreed to continue on the board by starting a second term.

The board reflected on what had been accomplished during its first year, simultaneously learning more about one another's gifts and interests, even as many members addressed finance, trustee, and staff-relations issues for the first time. With guiding principles, operating procedures, and a documents repository already in place as we enter 2026, we hope to be even more proactive and effective.

As reported last month, we had hoped to sustain in 2026 the ministries that were expanded in 2025 to reach more people and help them step more fully into their discipleship journeys. Although almost every household that previously committed financial support

has made a commitment for 2026, our anticipated revenue falls significantly short of anticipated expenses. Our ability to sustain these ministries through 2025 was only possible by tapping about \$100,000 from reserves that had been created by the generosity of previous congregations. The board realizes that this is not sustainable and has begun the process of determining which expenses can no longer be supported in 2026.

The board began to consider goals for 2026 and identified at least two. One relates to improving understanding of our evolving financial position and how our financial resources and decisions affect Faith's mission in our community. The other is to improve our ability as leaders to share a vision for Faith's ministries — present and future. In the short term, we want to give voice to members who have expressed interest in expanding existing ministries or starting new ones. To help connect members with shared passions, the board will be encouraging the congregation to participate in a retreat on Saturday, January 24, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. We will hear about some dreams already brewing and spend time naming what we care deeply about, where we think we can make a difference, and how we want to be a vibrant church for our greater Rockville community.
