World Pride Parade This Saturday

Faith UMC is registered to be a part of this parade and as in previous years, this will be a festive opportunity to provide witness to God's love for all LGBTQIA+ persons. We invite folks from Faith to join us at the <u>viewing area</u>, arranged by the DC Capital UMC Pride. In this area, people from all participating congregations will gather to watch the parade together. Please contact Jeff Bryant at <u>bryantjc4@icloud.com</u> to let him know you will be coming to the viewing area. Below are some basic logistics.

Viewing area for spectators: We will gather at 12:30 at the National City Christian Church, located at 5 Thomas Cir NW, Washington, DC 20005. There will be a UMC Holy Communion service at approximately 1:30 p.m. for viewers.



Transportation: We strongly recommend using public transportation. The closest Metrorail station to the

National City Christian Church at 5 Thomas Cir NW is <u>McPherson Square</u>, which is accessible via the Orange, Blue, and Silver Lines. A short walk north on 14th Street (approximately three blocks) from the 14th Street exit will take you to the church. Another option is to take the Red Line to <u>Dupont Circle</u> and walk southeast on Massachusetts Avenue (approximately five blocks) to the church.

Water: Bring plenty of water to stay hydrated; we suggest bringing more than you think you'll need.

Sun protection: Wear sunscreen, sunglasses, and/or other UV protective gear.

What to wear: lightweight, breathable clothing and comfortable/sturdy shoes. Check the forecast for parade day and bring weather-appropriate gear.

Preparing for Communion

Communion will be this Sunday, June 8 (this is a change from June 1). On the Sundays we share the Communion feast, we also share our abundance with others. We encourage you to bring non-perishables to worship. Items can be left in the shopping basket in the narthex. Your donations help keep the Blessing Box stocked.
