#### FAITH UMC CHARGE CONFERENCE

Tuesday, November 11 at 7:00 p.m.

This conference is an annual meeting with church leadership and a district superintendent to review the past year's ministry, conduct essential church business, and is responsible for approving nominations. The Charge Conference is important as it reflects the connectional nature of The United Methodist Church, where decisions are made cooperatively by clergy, laity, congregations and connectional leadership.

All members of Faith UMC are invited to attend. The meeting will take place via Zoom; credentials will be available at a later time.

This year's theme is "Love Boldly: Building a Bigger Table". Love Boldly a principle, inspired by Matthew 22:37-39 and John 13:34-35, encourages United Methodists to passionately love God and, like Jesus, to embrace and include people of every age, nation, race, gender, and walk of life. It means creating space for diversity and welcoming all neighbors and strangers. Building a Bigger Table: This phrase is a metaphor for radical hospitality and inclusion, emphasizing the need to make room for everyone in the community, especially those on the margins who might feel excluded or unwelcome in traditional settings.
