Juice, Joe, & Justice Sunday, May 18 Juice, Joe, and Justice (JJ&J) will be held following worship on Sunday, May 18, in room 206 ("the Youth Room"). We invite everyone to participate as we continue our monthly discussions about how our own identity and experiences may impact how we expand our love for all our neighbors. This month, we will explore the unexpected and sudden changes in employment status and fears about the future that have been experienced by members of Faith and their neighbors. Other circumstances can also cause



trauma that is physically and emotionally harmful, with lasting adverse effects on the individual's functioning and mental, physical, social, emotional, or spiritual well-being. Rev. Matt Norvell will share some of his insight as a hospital chaplain about developing skills to practice self-care and self-regulation.
