Report from the Leadership Board

The Leadership Board met on November 19. It began to develop the 2026 operating budget, intending to sustain the ministries that were expanded in 2025 to reach more people and help them step more fully into their discipleship journey. Anticipated revenues remain somewhat uncertain, as the Stewardship Team reported that about a dozen households that previously committed financial support had not yet made a commitment for 2026. (At this time, that number is 8 – if you've not made your commitment, help us plan by doing that online today.)

As reported quarterly to the congregation, the largest component of the budget is for ministries, and mostly human resources for ministries, which we would like to continue fully. We also wish to continue to tithe (10%) from our pledges and offerings to fund our outreach budget, meeting needs in our community and elsewhere. Almost a quarter of the budget is for building maintenance, likely to increase as it ages. Concern was expressed that while we had reserves to cover the anticipated 2025 deficit, and even one in 2026, if necessary, that path is not sustainable. We all benefit from the investments made in the building by Faith's congregations decades ago. If we are to continue our ministries, we will need to raise more money to maintain the building, just as previous members of Faith supported the initial capital building fund.

Grateful for the continuity of our staff, the Board approved a cost-of-living increase for them for 2026, using the same percentage increase that will be applied to Social Security benefits. We also discussed performance evaluation of non-clergy staff, emphasizing the importance of consistency in the evaluation process, anticipating that evaluations will be

completed by year end. Jennifer Young and Brian Jones agreed to lead a workgroup to review the current procedures and propose updates as necessary.

Janelle Veazey led a discussion on behalf of the workgroup planning a "Vision Retreat" for this winter. The main goals would be to invite Faith members to think about and commit to what they are called to do in their church and community and to facilitate networking amongst like-minded people. The date for this retreat and other details are to be determined with further discussion planned for December.

The Board accepted the recommendation of the Building Integrity Team (BIT) to commission a comprehensive building inspection to effectively guide long-term planning, budgeting, and maintenance prioritization, and approved funding for it. We also approved the transfer of funds from our investments to our local bank to cover cash flow needs related to paying contractors to replace the sanctuary doors and make other security upgrades. As reported last month, Faith received a \$95,500 grant from the state for these upgrades, but will receive those funds as reimbursement after the projects are completed.




