- · Planting bulbs for a colorful spring


The garden team will provide plenty of tools and gloves, so just bring your energy and enthusiasm!

Special Edition of Juice, Joe, & Justice

Sunday, November 16, following worship

We will be welcoming two guests to this month's meeting of Juice, Joe, & Justice held after worship in room 206 (the Youth Room). Christine King is one of the cofounders of the New Neighbor Interfaith Alliance (NNIA). This organization ministers to 102 refugee families, comprised of 405 individuals, who live in Montgomery County. NNIA's 33 members include 12 Christian churches, nine Jewish congregations, and three Islamic groups. Ms. King will be joined by Debra



Randall, a member of our sister congregation, Grace United Methodist Church in Gaithersburg. Ms. Randall chairs the Food Committee of NNIA. The guest speakers will provide an overall description of NNIA's activities, with a particular emphasis on its food program. All members of the congregation are invited to join this special edition of JJ&J!

A Pilgrimage with the Prophets

What is a pilgrimage? From Compostela to Canterbury, it is an intentional journey to a revered place. There may be obstacles—boulders to climb over or rushing streams to ford—but they are part of the journey. To Christians, Advent is a spiritual pilgrimage that leads us, like the Wise Men, to the stable, the manger and the Baby Jesus.

At Faith Church on November 16, we are starting our own pilgrimage, choosing as our guide the words of the prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, and John. Though Advent begins on November 30, we have timed our departure as pilgrims early, in order to explore the wisdom of the prophets as we travel spiritually through Advent to Christmas Eve.


