Report from the Leadership Board

The Leadership Board met January 11, welcoming Kathy King and Tamara Fish as new members, acknowledging that Tamara was also now Faith's Lay Leader. Members renewed our Covenant of Confidentiality. The Board strives to make all decisions by consensus. Although members of the Board are very interested in receiving input and answering questions from the congregation, the specific proposals and justifications offered by individuals on the Board and discussions about staff remain confidential.

The Board reviewed the budget that had been tentatively approved in December. While our stewardship campaign last fall was very successful in achieving generous pledges from many households, the expenses of maintaining the building and sustaining all ministries have also increased. The Board made the difficult decision to eliminate the part-time position of coordinator of intergenerational nurture and the communications contract with the Lakeland Institute that had enabled our office administrator more flexibility to support community outreach, congregational care and other programming. Although the February session of Messy Church was cancelled, the Board reiterated its support of a laity-led, outward-facing ministry providing an alternative form of worship for people who are not already involved with Faith and who are unlikely to enter traditional worship spaces.

The Board identified other budget lines that will also need to be decreased and asked Pastor Laura to meet with managers of those programs to identify further savings. In coming months, the Board may identify needs/opportunities for members of the congregation to help to promote use of the building to prospective renters, so maintenance of our building is not as dependent on pledges and offerings. There may also be opportunities to help in the office, answering doors and phones. Even as we seek to reduce

expenses, in coming months the Board will explore other approaches to increasing income for preservation of the building and creating a legacy for future followers of Jesus here.

In its efforts to consider how Faith can best serve the community with its 4.8 acres of property, the Board received a progress report from Kathy King about the status of the feasibility study of affordable housing. Further information will be forthcoming as that work continues.

Finally, the Board reviewed its role in the Vision Retreat, which was held January 24. Thirty people participated in half-day gathering to think deeply about the passions God has placed in our hearts and how our God-given talents can make a difference in the community. Ideas were generated for expansion of several ministries at Faith and participants were encouraged to identify others who share their vision, inviting others to share opportunities to learn more or take an action step together.
