#### A PILGRIMAGE WITH THE PROPHETS

What is a pilgrimage? From Compostela to Canterbury, it is an intentional journey to a revered place. To Christians, Advent is a spiritual pilgrimage that leads us, like the Wise Men, to the stable, the manger and the Baby Jesus.

At Faith Church on November 16, we are starting our own pilgrimage, choosing as our guide the words of the prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, and John. Though Advent begins on November 30, we have timed our departure as pilgrims early, in order to explore the wisdom of the prophets as we travel spiritually through Advent to Christmas Eve.

## November 16 - Isaiah 9:1-7

"People who walked in darkness have seen a great light."

One of the roles of the prophets is to trigger a new imagination. This week, we encourage you to celebrate the promises of God and to broaden your hopes and expectations.

#### Consider:

- What joy and hope do you see being born in the world around you?
- Some commentators see Isaiah's words about a
   "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father
   and Prince of Peace," as a reference to the birth of
   Jesus. As we approach Advent, consider your current
   faith journey. What name or title would you give to
   Jesus?
- In what ways might you serve as a light to the world this week?

# On a sacred journey (John 8:12)

Jesus says, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." Using poetry, journaling, doodling or drawing, paints, music and movement, or any other medium you wish, explore and illuminate what the "light of life" means. How can you illustrate it to those who might be curious?
